More groundwork for the renovation at Sime



With two months to go before we take over managing the Sime public course and Clubhouse, the team has been hard at work getting the final pieces in place so that we are ready to start work with the start of the new year.

With regard to the golf course, the tender for the main contractor and the irrigation work has been called. The tender award is expected to be given before the end of the year, and the project commission is expected to begin next year.

Our plans for the Clubhouse need a bit more work as we finalise the plans based on the proposal from the architect. We are working hard to prepare the tender documents and get approval from the authorities with

regard to various aspects of the plan.

At the same time, Keppel Club is also appealing to the government for a temporary extension of lease for the golf course and Keppel

Club's clubhouse at Bukit Chermin. However, this is subject to approval and there is no guarantee that we will get any further extension on top of what we have already been granted.

Managing COVID-19 cases amongst Keppel Club staff



As part of our efforts to keep Keppel Club members and staff safe, we have been conducting regular tests of our frontline staff since September, and of all our staff who work on site since October.

On Oct 9, 2021, we discovered that three of our golf course maintenance staff living in our dormitory had tested positive for COVID-19 on the Actigen Rapid Test (ART) self-test kit.

We immediately took action, sending these three staff for a polymerase chain reaction test as needed. We also prepared a facility for the affected staff to be isolated in, and arranged deep cleaning of the dormitory and areas which they work in.

Besides this, we also made the decision to have all our staff take an ART test every other day, in order to keep attendees at the ongoing Keppel Charity Golf event safe.

There were some further positive test results despite receiving negative test results on earlier tests, meaning that we had detected these cases early through our stringent testing. In all, between Oct 9 to 28, 2021, we had 18 staff who were affected, with two currently still under isolation.



To ensure that affected staff were well looked after, nutritious food was prepared at Tee Top and brought to the staff who were in isolation at the designated facility.

Upon receiving notification of a positive ART test result, the Club immediately arranged for sanitisation of the locations where the affected staff worked. Most of these cases were from the staff living in the dormitory, meaning that there was minimal spread outside of the dormitory. Thankfully, all the affected staff had been vaccinated and had mild or no symptoms during the period they tested positive for COVID-19.

As part of our efforts to look after the staff who had been affected, we ensured that they were provided with nutritious meals cooked by the chefs at Tee Top. We also continued to check on their health and mental state, making sure that they felt comfortable and well until their ART tests returned negative results according to the Ministry of Health guidelines, and they could return to their posts.

Moving forward, we will continue to take every precaution to keep Keppel Club members and staff alike safe. This includes continued regular testing, and encouraging those who are unwell to stay home. We will also continue to closely follow MOH's prescribed guidelines should there be new COVID-19 cases in the Keppel Club family.

Keppel Charity Golf 2021

A historic last charity game at Bukit Chermin

Keppel Club's time at Bukit Chermin may be ending, but the spirit of giving still burns brighter than ever.

With a record turnout of 950 golfers and an unprecedented \$2.6 million raised, Keppel Charity Golf's (KCG) outstanding result this year brings a perfect close to this chapter of the event's history at its Bukit Chermin site.

KCG has achieved many milestones since its inception in the 1970s. This year's edition blazes a new trail forward and sets the tone for many more to come.

A historic moment

Held between Oct 9 to 17, this year's KCG uncharacteristically stretched over two weekends instead of one to accommodate overwhelming support.

It also marks the third year of KCG's partnership with the President's Challenge. Together, proceeds from

KCG go towards benefiting a larger swathe of agencies that support underserved communities.

The Club was privileged to once again have President Halimah Yacob grace the event on Oct 17 this year.

In commemoration of the event, President Halimah signed a golf bag

with a plaque and witnessed the drive-past by representatives from Keppel Club's 18 beneficiaries.

Expressing her gratitude for Keppel Club's fundraising efforts, she praised the Club's "steadfast commitment" to supporting the underprivileged in Singapore.

ESM Goh Chok Tong also opened the newly renovated 18 hole golf course back in 2004. With this year's KCG being the last charity game to be held at Bukit Chermin, his attendance was especially poignant. We marked the occasion with a photo with one of the plaques commemorating his opening of the 18 hole golf course.



“It is with your support that we can better overcome the crisis of our generation,” she says.

This year’s edition was also blessed to have Emeritus Senior Minister Mr Goh Chok Tong and Club Chairman Mr Tan Chong Meng participate in one of the early morning flights on Oct 9.

For many stalwarts among the club community, it was reminiscent of 2004, when ESM Goh opened the club’s newly renovated 18 holes.

What was most significant, however, was the event’s record participation and funds raised.

Over 300 golfers participated in 2019’s KCG, and more than 470 in 2020’s event; that number skyrocketed to 950 this year. With a total of \$2.6 million raised, this marks the ninth consecutive year that KCG has surpassed the million-dollar milestone.

That sum will also go towards a larger pool of beneficiaries. 2019's edition benefited a total of 67 agencies supported by the President's Challenge, with 2020 seeing this number grow to 72. This year, funds donated to the President's Challenge will benefit 93 charities.

The number of Keppel Club's selected beneficiaries has also increased to a total of 18 this year, up from 15 last year.

A club legacy

Those impressive numbers are among many feats KCG has achieved over the years.

In 1997, proceeds from that year's edition raised funds for 12 beneficiaries. Seven years later in 2004, the Club celebrated its centennial year by raising \$400,000 for 16 charities.

KCG first raised more than a million dollars in 2013, and the event has consistently raised even more funds every subsequent year.

The club's partnership with the President's Challenge in 2019 further enhanced KCG's reputation as a public-spirited event. Nearly 300 golfers came together to raise a grand total of \$1,283,800 that year.

KCG's funds have also benefited ever more beneficiaries over time. This year, the club is thankful to receive hand-drawn cards from the Society for the Physically Disabled (SPD) and hand-painted gifts from the children of the National Arthritis Foundation, in addition to many other lovely tokens of gratitude from the beneficiaries.

A fun time for all

Beyond the games, this year's KCG was also designed to bring fun to everyone.

Two new food trucks were stationed at the starter point and halfway house this year. Black-hued and emblazoned with the club logo, they provided a wide assortment of mouthwatering snacks including takoyaki, chicken satay, and even freshly prepared sashimi.

Golfers could also enter a lucky draw by playing the fun hole at Hole 6. Those who successfully landed a golf ball onto a floating platform walked away with golf merchandise.

There were also many opportunities for this year's participants to meet and mingle. Beautiful orchids adorning the halfway house's fountain made for a perfect photo backdrop, while a whisky and carpet auction attracted connoisseurs eyeing a good deal.

Even bad weather could not dampen everyone's high spirits. Games were delayed due to intermittent rain on Oct 10 and 17, but most golfers opted to resume their plays anyway.

This will be the last time KCG is held at Bukit Chermin, but it certainly won't be the last of Keppel Club's generous spirit.

Leaving Bukit Chermin Spirit of Charity

In her speech during the 51st Keppel Charity Golf (KCG) tournament, president Halimah Yacob praised the club's fundraising efforts and highlighted its significance as a partner of the President's Challenge.

For Club members in attendance, the president's speech was a testament to how far KCG has come. Even as the event reaches new heights, its mission to help society's underserved and underprivileged has not changed.

Bigger and better every year

Since its launch in 1970, KCG has raised more funds every successive year.

Its final run at Bukit Chermin this year raised a whopping S\$2.6 million – more than 20 times 1996's tally. Prior to that, KCG was already raising more than S\$1 million every year since 2013.



In his speech at KCG 2021, Keppel Club Chairman Mr Tan Chong Meng called our final charity golf event a grand finale for the Club, who has looked after this corner of Bukit Chermin for almost 118 years.

Beneficiaries of the funds raised also grew in number over time.

In 1997, 12 charities – Jamiyah Children's Home and Chen Su Lan Methodist Children's Home among them – benefited from new facilities paid for by funds raised during KCG. That number would surge more than sixfold in 2019, when Keppel Club

entered into a partnership with the President's Challenge.

Over time, KCG also started to attract a bigger, more prominent crowd. Past Guests-of-Honour have included politicians like Deputy Prime Minister Heng Swee Keat, Minister for Finance Mr Lawrence Wong, and Emeritus Senior Minister Goh Chok Tong.

Going the extra mile

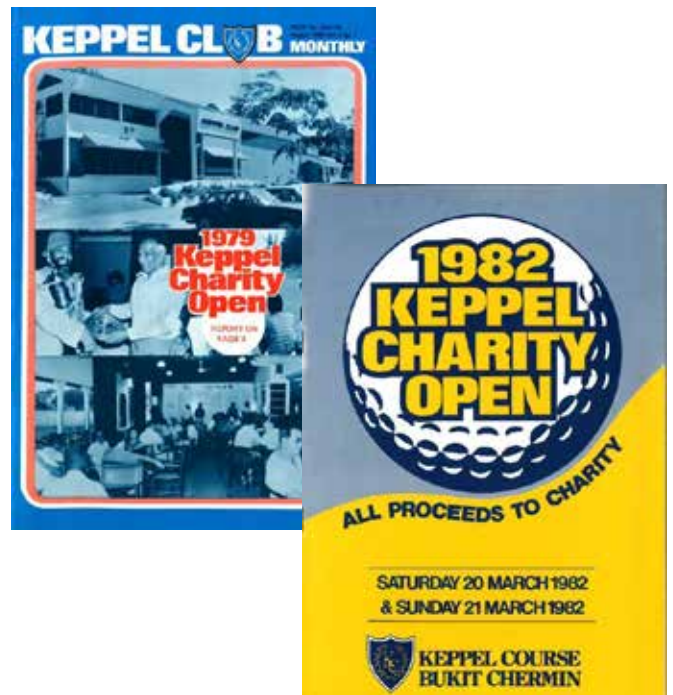
To the Club, KCG is more than just an annual ritual. The event also represents the club’s unwavering commitment to charity.

This was made clear in 2014, when the club’s annual President’s Trophy was scheduled alongside that year’s KCG in a bid to raise more funds. That commitment was reiterated in 2020, when Keppel Club still hosted KCG as usual despite the uncertainties of COVID-19. KCG was the only charity golf event held in Singapore that year.

At the same time, KCG isn’t solely about golfing for charity.

Keppel Club also sponsored several charity events over the years, including the Children’s Cancer Foundation’s annual Tulips Hearts Day in 1996.

5 stretches to help with back pain

Four out of every five of us will experience back pain at some point in our lives. That sounds unfortunate, but the good news is that practicing good stretching can reduce the discomfort it brings.

For golfers, good back health is paramount to keeping your game strong. A strong back makes for nimbler hips, and more powerful swings. If you're unsure where to start, give these 5 quick and easy stretches a try.

A quick note: back stretches are not a remedy for back pain. Performed incorrectly, some stretches have also been proven to worsen back pain. Please consult a doctor for advice, and check in with our trainers if you're unsure how to properly perform a stretch.

Knee-to-chest stretch

A simple stretch that requires little effort, knee-to-chest stretches are great for restoring flexibility in your lower back muscles. It's also known to help relax your hips, thighs and gluts after a long day of constantly sitting down.

For added support, consider placing a cushion under your head, or wrapping a towel around your leg to make it easier for your arms to reach.

Step 1

Lie on your back. Bend both your knees while keeping your feet flat on the floor.

Step 2

With your left knee straight, bring your right knee towards your chest. Clasp your hands behind your thigh.

Step 3

Extend your spine all the way down towards the tailbone. Do not lift your hips.

Step 4

In this pose, take deep breaths. Hold for 30 seconds to a minute.

Step 5

Repeat with the other leg.

Pelvic tilt

An essential stretch for strengthening the abdominal muscles, pelvic tilts also relieve pain and tenseness in your lower back. This stretch also have beneficial effects on your glutes and hamstrings.

Step 1

Lying on your back, bend both knees and keep your feet flat on the floor.

Step 2

Tense your abdominal muscles and flatten your back against the floor.

Step 3

Hold this position for up to 10 seconds.

Step 4

Return to your initial position. Take deep breaths to relax.

Step 5

Do 1 to 3 sets with 5 repetitions each.

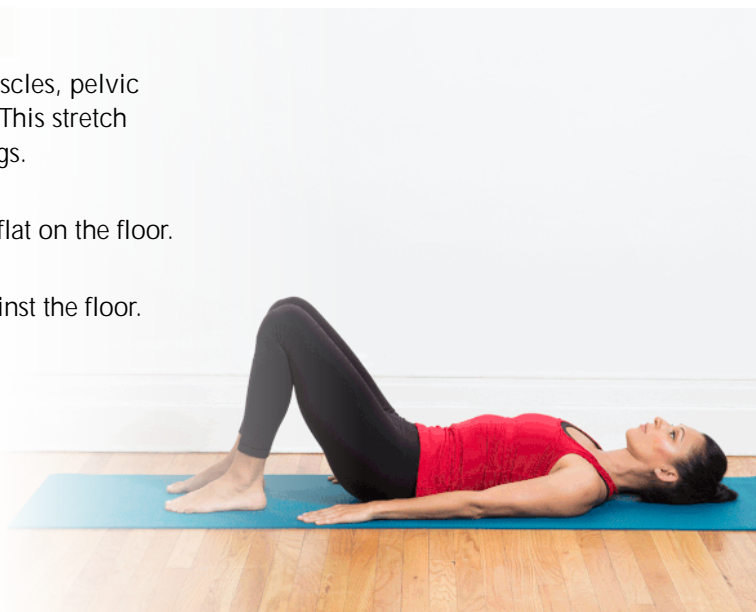

Cat – Cow

Also known as the Chakravakasana pose, Cat-Cow is a basic Yoga pose that invigorates your spine while simultaneously stretching your chest, neck, and shoulders.

Note that this stretch may not be suitable for everybody. Refrain from overstretching in the pose as it puts unnecessary pressure on your abdomen.

Step 1

Place yourself on all fours in a tabletop position.

Step 2

Press your body into your hands and feet. Inhale and gradually look up.

Step 3

Slowly exhale. Tuck your chin towards your chest while arching your spine towards the ceiling.

Step 4

Repeat this pattern for 1 to 2 minutes. Time your movements with each breath.

Child's pose

Another yoga pose, the Child's pose is a stretch that passively elongates your spine while you rest over your knees. It also stretches your core abdominal muscles connecting your lower back to the long leg bone.

Step 1

Rest your hips and buttocks on your lower legs and feet.

Step 2

With your knees apart, gradually fold your body forwards. Bring your chest down towards your knees as much as possible.

Step 3

Stretch your arms out in front. Your hands should rest on the floor while your arms are kept straight.

Step 4

Maintain this position for 20 to 30 seconds.

Step 5

With your hands, slowly return to an upright position.

Bridge stretch

A basic stretch that comprises many variations, the bridge stretch targets your gluts and hamstrings. It is an ideal warm-up before your strength-training routine, and also a great rehabilitation exercise for building core stability.

A proper bridge stretch places stress on the shoulders rather than the back. Correct your position if you feel uncomfortable strain on your back while doing this exercise.

Step 1

Lie down on the floor. Keep your feet flat on the floor and arms by your side.

Step 2

Bend your knees and tense your buttocks. Raise your pelvis towards the ceiling. Make sure that your back is off the ground.



Step 3

Hold for five seconds.

Step 4

Gently lower your torso and return to the initial position

Step 5

Repeat three sets, with 12 to 15 repetitions each.

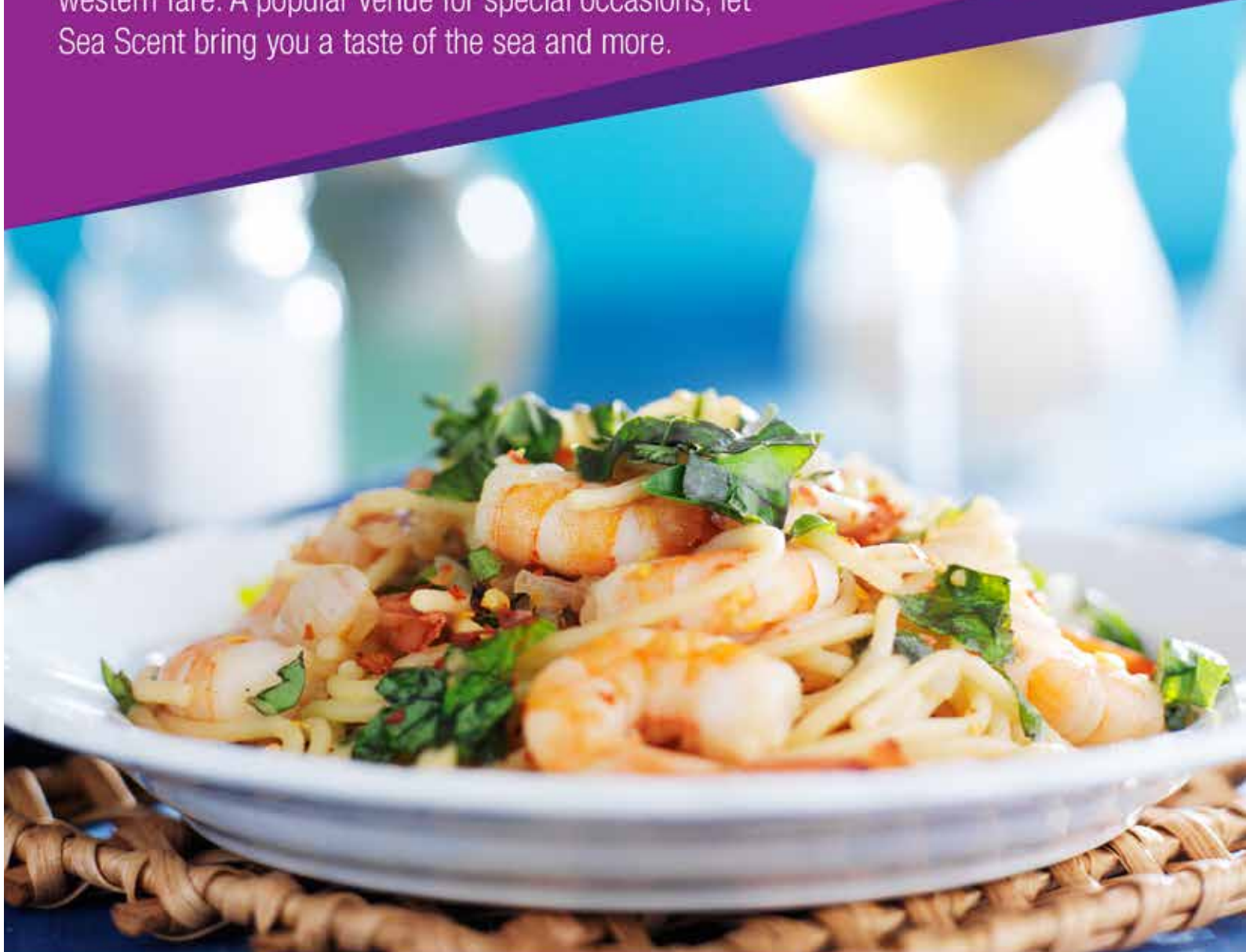
